San Joaquin Delta College is the successor of the Stockton Junior College. College of Pacific rented space and equipment only. Pacific instructors taught the classes, but were employed and responsible to the Stockton Board of Education.




The physical separation of Stockton College and College of the Pacific was followed in 1951 by the resumption of lower division classes at Pacific.

Long decades without a permanent home created a desire at San Joaquin Delta College to make its new campus something special. Two key decisions were endorsed by College trustees in the fall of 1968. Though the campus would be one of the largest in California, the student population would be divided into five instructional centers. The design of each center included a central open courtyard, snack bar and study lounge. The goal is to encourage students and faculty to develop activities according to their own interests, creating a healthy campus-wide diversity.

Students with greatly different backgrounds and career interests, musicians and mechanics-meet in the hallways, lounges and sometimes classrooms and learn to respect each other's values.



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
